Department of K-Silkroad Turkic Studies Admission Guide for International Students (2026 Spring)

## **Program Overview**

The K-Silkroad Turkic Studies Department is a multidisciplinary master's program exploring the historical, linguistic, cultural, and socio-economic connections between Korea and the Turkic world — including Türkiye, Azerbaijan, Central Asia, and Russia. It combines academic research with practical cooperation, nurturing future leaders in culture, diplomacy, policy, and development.

#### **Key Features:**

- First and only Turkic regional studies program in Korea
- Courses in Korean, English, and Turkic languages
- Interdisciplinary curriculum: history, politics, culture, gender, translation, cooperation studies
- Practice-based learning: international projects, seminars, internships
- Optional non-thesis track (5 semesters)

### Curriculum & Study Options

- Choose among five specialized tracks, with flexible cross-registration.
- Up to 6 undergraduate Korean language credits can count toward the MA degree.
- Additional 3 graduate-level Korean courses available for foreign students.
- Degree: Master of Arts (M.A.) in Regional Studies K-Silkroad Turkic Studies

Outstanding applicants from Türkiye, Azerbaijan, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and other Turkic nations will receive a special tuition reduction and living support package.

#### **E** Eligibility & Language Requirements

- Bachelor's degree (or expected graduation) from a 4-year university in Korea or abroad.
- Both parents must hold non-Korean citizenship.
- TOPIK Level 3 or higher, or equivalent.
- Applicants without Korean proficiency are welcome; Korean study is required within the first year.
- Some courses conducted in English or Turkic languages.

### **Q** Required Documents (All documents must be issued within 3 months)

- 1. Application Form Download from DDWU website and complete in English or Korean.
- 2. Bachelor's Diploma or Certificate of (Expected) Graduation.
- 3. Official Transcript Must include GPA (4.5 or 100-point scale).
- 4. Copy of Passport Applicant and both parents.
- 5. Alien Registration Card (if residing in Korea).
- 6. Apostille or Consular Legalization Diploma and transcript (mandatory for foreign universities).
- 7. Bank Balance Certificate Minimum KRW 20,000,000 (valid for 6 months or more).
- 8. Curriculum Vitae / Certificate of Career (if applicable).
- 9. Proof of Language Proficiency TOPIK, English, or equivalent.
- 10. Financial Sponsor's Certificate & Relationship Proof (if sponsor ≠ applicant).
- △ All non-English/Korean documents must be translated and notarized.
